Accessing your money at an ATM.

Increasingly, high street cash machines are being adapted to help blind and partially sighted people to access their cash easily and safely.

- A number of ATMs now have the ability to talk to customers. To use these you need a pair of earphones. Any standard earphones will work - like the ones you get with a mobile phone
- Each talking ATM has a headphone jack, usually placed on the right-hand side of the screen. Some headphone jacks are shaped like a wedge sticking out slightly, whilst others are flush to the ATM but have a round button next to them
- Once you plug your earphones into the ATM it will give you instructions, asking you to press the appropriate button on the key pad to indicate your choices
- You can use any ATM that talks which supports Mastercard. If you would like to try an ATM in a quiet environment, ask a local branch if you can be shown how to use one inside, rather than a machine on the street. Another good tip is to only put one ear phone in one of your ears: that way you can hear the instructions but also hear what is going on around you.

If you are unsure where your nearest talking ATM is you can use the free ATM locator app provided by LINK. Through the app you can:

- Filter for ATMs that have audio assistance features,
- Filter for ATMs that dispense £5 notes, are free to use, or are operated by a particular bank or other organisation,
- Get directions by foot, car, and public transport to the selected cash points
- Save your favourite ATMs and be alerted when you are nearby to remind you to withdraw cash
- Find advice and guidance on how to use ATMs safely and securely
- Search other areas for ATMs to help you plan ahead.

Many ATMs now also provide tactile features to help you use them, including a raised dot on the 5 button of the key pad, braille labels on the panel and a funneled entry point for your card to be entered. Many are also installed at a height suitable for wheelchair users.
